2022 Bill Draft: Protecting Students from Action Civics

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to protect students from action civics.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

Section 1. That a NEW SECTION by added:

For purposes of this Act, the term, protest, means a public, organized demonstration expressing a particular position, either for or against an idea or action, especially a political one.

Section 2. That a NEW SECTION by added:

For purposes of this Act, the term, lobby, means:

- 1. to promote, oppose, or influence the passage or defeat of, or the sponsorship or introduction of, any ballot measure as defined by § 2-1-1.3(4), ballot question as defined by § 12-27-1(1), law, rule as defined by §§ 1-26-1(6) and (8), or resolution or ordinance as defined by §§ 7-18A-1 and 9-19-1,
- 2. to attempt to influence an individual to vote for or against a particular candidate for any public office, or
- 3. to attempt to influence any public officer in the performance of their duties.

This term does not include educational activities or assignments that simulate protest or lobbying in a school setting.

Section 3. That a NEW SECTION by added:

An institution of higher education under the control of either the Board of Regents or the Board of Technical Education, or state-accredited school district may not direct, require, or compel a student to protest or lobby as part of a grade, course, or credit.

Nothing in this section prevents any student from voluntarily and freely exercising their freedom of speech.

Section 4. That a NEW SECTION be added:

No state money may be expended for any purpose prohibited in Section 3 by any institution of higher education under the control of either the Board of Regents or the Board of Technical Education, or any state-accredited school districts.
